Flashback

Janette Glover-Geidt

With our Flu' season almost over, we look back at the "SPANISH FLU" of 1918. No flu' shots. No antibiotics. Little knowledge about germs and infections.

The Spanish Flu' was brought to North America by returning soldiers. By government decree, municipalities could close all public gatherings. Mayor Harrison of Cumberland did this but felt that it should apply to unincorporated areas like Union Bay. He wanted to ban travel between the two towns because of the many ships from foreign ports.

A few days after this decree, a returning soldier brought the "Flu" to the District. The passenger coach in which he traveled to Cumberland from the Port, and his fellow passengers were fumigated.

The Chinese were hardest hit. By mid-November, 29 Chinese at Union Bay had it. A Chinese doctor from Victoria came up to treat them. Still, 18 Orientals died in the Valley. Nettie Marshall (Jones) was the first white person to contract the flu. Her Mother and three siblings were all sick at once. Mr. Marshall and 12 year old Bill looked after them; wiping them down, emptying chamber pots, giving them water. The company nurse, Mrs. Reid, also attended the family. She made pneumonia jackets for them, which were supposed to keep their lungs warm. Neighbours brought soups and stews, but being wary, left them on the doorstep.



With most of the suffering over by Christmas, the statistics were published. The District population was 3,184 with 1,598 flu cases and 28 deaths. In Union Bay 72 cases were reported, with 4 deaths, all of them Chinese.





Apply before March 31 for a UBCU student bursary

Our credit union is only as strong as the communities we serve. That's why we're incredibly proud to award up to \$5,250 in student bursaries each year to help our members pursue their educational endeavours.

Each spring, we award up to seven bursaries of \$750 each to deserving Union Bay Credit Union members or their children/dependents. Applicants may be either high school students moving on to post-secondary studies or adult learners returning to formal education. Recipients are chosen based on their community involvement, achievement and financial need.

"The costs of post-secondary education have risen exponentially, and consequently so has the amount of the bursaries we award each year," says UBCU director and bursary committee member Dianne Christensen. "In the past 10 years, the total value of the bursaries we award has increased 700 per cent as both community need and our capacity to help have grown."

Applications for UBCU adult learner bursaries will be accepted until March 31; download an application at www.ubcu.ca/Person-al/CommunityConnect/Bursaries or ask for one at your local Union Bay Credit Union branch. High school students must apply through their respective schools. Adult learner bursary recipients will be selected in mid-April.

"If you're a high school or continuing education student with a tie to UBCU, we want to help support you financially with the cost of your education," says Christensen. "As a community credit union, supporting our members is simply at the heart of everything we do."
