

Flashback - 'Summer Fun'

Summer fun in Union Bay meant hours spent in and about the ocean at Sandy or Coal Beach or the Government Wharf. In Baynes Sound, with the protection of Denman Island, our water is about the warmest on Vancouver Island.

The young boys formed a swim and dive team and competitions against teams from Cumberland were held at either Comox Lake or Union Bay. At the wharf the fellows erected diving boards at different heights on top of the freight shed where Bill Auchinvole executed beautiful swan dives and Harry Glover perfected the jack-knife. Competitions of long distance races were swum to Denman, or Royston to Comox, where Charlie Formby, who had competed in England, and Albert Cooper were winners. A girl, visiting the Strand family in 1913, swam to Tree Island.

At the head of the Bay the beach was composed of coal fines. When the tide came over the warm, protected beach the water was warmed for swimming. There was an old scow beached there which made a great place for playing when the tide was out, and a perfect place to swim to and dive off when the tide was in. As well, there was always plenty of driftwood to make boats and rafts. With a little imagination, you could pretend you were paddling the ocean blue of the South Sea Islands, just like in the movies.

The wharf extended out from the bottom of McLeod Road. South of the wharf was the original old rock jetty. In the 1930's the company brought in scow loads of sand from the Sandy Islands to create "Sandy Beach" beside the rock pile. This became the favourite spot to swim. The old store, turned store house, was still beside the path down. This and the Japanese boxwood growing around it made a makeshift change room. Families brought picnics and spent the day there. With the soft sand and warm water, it was safe for the little ones, with plenty of room for the older kids to practice their dog paddling.

Union Bay Streamkeepers are looking for help!!

Every year the Union Bay Streamkeepers catch Coho fry in the creeks around Union Bay and take them to the Rosewall Creek hatchery. The fry need to be taken from the creeks before the water disappears or gets to warm. When the water levels rise again in the fall the fry are returned to the creeks they came from.

We are looking for volunteers to help with catching the fry. A session works like this:

- Traps are picked up in Union Bay and taken to a creek. There they
 are baited and put in the creek. The traps are left there for about an hour then
 they are picked up, hopefully loaded with Coho fry.
- The fry are then taken to the Rosewall hatchery where they are counted and put in tanks.

Trapping the fry starts at the beginning of June and end in mid-July.


