

UNION BAY SCHOOLS:

Janette Glover-Geidt

In the early days the Government had a rule: "Before a school could be funded there had to be 15 pupils". In 1896 John Cook and his family arrived. Almost enough kids.

"I was not old enough to go to school, but they had to have one more before they could get a teacher. So I went and slept half the day."

The Company provided a house (2nd house north of Russell St.). After a couple of years, the parents felt a proper schoolhouse was needed. Trustee Mike Manson led the drive. In the fall of 1899, it was built in 16 days for \$600, on land donated by the Union Coal Company. Painted with red oxide (the same as the Company houses and coal cars) it became known as the Little Red School House. It was one big room, with the primary children facing one black board and the older students facing the other, a pot bellied stove in the middle. "There would be two boys appointed as janitors, they got 10c a day or \$2 a month. There was a coal shed at the back. You swept the floors, took out the ashes, cleaned the boards and brushes. Then you brought in fresh kindling wood and coal in a big scuttle. The outhouse was in a separate little building. Girls on one side, boys on the other. You had to put lime down that."

About 1909 another room was added. But by 1914, with an enrolment of sixty-five, a new school was built in front. The old schoolhouse was put on skids and moved back where it became the Community Hall. The new school was built for \$6,300 with a full basement housing a coal furnace, with boys' and girls' washrooms. Each was furnished with three toilets, two 14' high and one 16" high. A wide stairway led up from the front door, and two side stairways from the basement: girls on one side, boys on the other. Each classroom had a cloakroom, three walls of chalkboard, one wall of tall windows, and eight drop cord lights.

"We had some fun watching them build the school. Then the day we all marched in – it was quite a day to remember! The old school just had outhouses, then, it was indoors. We were putting our hands up every five minutes"

A third room was added in 1922, with two more classrooms in 1953. Due to a low enrolment, the school closed in June 2006.



Robin Sherling The History Behind The Signs



Robin moved onto Tappin Street in Union Bay about 1980 with her children Ginny, Candy, Carly, Isaac and Josh. She soon became a huge part of our community. About that time, a Beautification Committee was formed with the intention of sprucing up our town. Volunteers filled in the deep ditches that ran through the middle of Union Bay; they then planted the flowers, shrubs and grass that you see today.

In the early 1990's, Robin, being a very talented wood carver, designed and carved the beautiful Welcome Signs that you see on both sides of Union Bay.

She then donated them. One of the signs was stolen within the first month and she generously carved another one to replace it.

If you look around Union Bay and see a hand carved sign, it is most likely a gift from her. She loved the people of this community and was always willing to lend a hand. After raising her children in the Bay, she moved to Nanaimo where she became a support worker in a care facility.

Today she still loves carving and enjoys her grown children and her many grandchildren.
