On top of that, we award up to \$5,250 in bursaries each year to local students pursuing post-secondary education and we ensure that every single voting member, as a part-owner of the cooperative, is eligible for an annual dividend payment.

And because all of our decisions are made right here at our branches in Union Bay, Bowser and on Hornby Island, we'll continue to support those communities. After all, our credit union is only as strong as the communities we serve.

THE UNION BAY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

NOVEMBER 11, 2107 - REMEMBRANCE DAY

We are coming up to Remembrance Day, always a significant event in Canada and never forgotten in Union Bay. This year as in years past, we will gather at the Cairn at 10:40 a.m. or in the Community Hall if it is raining, to hold a service of commemoration.



Following the service, refreshments will be served in the Hall, and once again the "Just For Joy" singers and all-round good sports will entertain at 12:00 with a show called "Sentimental Journey". See the poster in this issue for more details. We always have a great turnout for this event and look forward to seeing old and new friends there.

FLASHBACK:

'SCHOOL DAYS' Janette Glover-Geidt has sent us a collection of very amusing quotes from the good old days at Union Bay School. Boy, did those kids ever get up to mischief!!!

Read on:

"SCHOOL TEACHERS: "An eagle flying through the air caught Miss De Beau by the hair. When he found she was a fool, He dropped her into Union Bay School." !!!!!!!!! Poem by Jim McKay

The first teacher appointed was Miss Dalby. The second, Mr. McKinnon M.A. took advantage of the boats in port for geography lessons. At the closing exercise in 1899 handing out awards were the Post Office Inspector, Mayor of Victoria and the Lt. Governor who addressed the class on the evils of the cramming system.

Originally, the School Board was given \$20 per student per year. In 1905 it was changed to \$480 per teacher per year. Out of this had to come all the school's expenses including the teacher's salary.

"Union Bay was classified as a Superior School," This meant that teachers got a bit more money, but the big thing about coming to Union Bay was the hand driven Gestetner machine. We could buy one workbook and take it off for the whole class, it sure beat the old jelly pad." **Donald McDonald**

Any teacher with doubtful control was taken advantage of.

"Miss Russell was supposed to have a weak heart. She'd do a fainting spell and one of us boys would run and get a cup of swamp water and revive her. When she came to and saw the cup of slimy water she'd faint again!"

Mr. Hill, who had a hook arm used to pull the kids around by their sweaters, he did not last long.

"One day a drunken sailor came roaring into the school yard and asked us kids if we wanted a holiday. The sailor beat the teacher up and shoved him out a window. One of the kids ran off and got Jimmy McNeil, who also had only one arm, he hauled off and hit the sailor. That was good for a holiday. The teacher never came back. "!! Jim McKay

Getting a holiday was the ambition of many boys:

"If we wanted a holiday we'd take a wet sack and stuff it down the chimney; the smoke would fill the school and we'd get a holiday. !!!!!!!! **Hector Hooper**

One spring we wanted a holiday so Tom McKay went downstairs and piddled all over the furnace. The smell came up over the whole school." !!!!!!!! Kay (Fornby) Carter




