This year the Lions are celebrating their 100th anniversary and want to see growth.





The Gals Behind The Tour de Rock

At one time, the Union Bay membership to the BC Old Age Pensioners Association was more than 80 people. They met often to play cards, have coffee and of course, tell stories. With the cost of fees and the dwindling membership, a decision was made to disband from the BCOAP Association and start up a local club called the Friendly Port Seniors.

Mildred Coe, along with Donna McKay, have been the secretaries as well as doing behind the scenes work organizing events for 37 years. The 12 members included Myrtle McKay, Isabelle Hood, Carol McKay, Sharon Knox, Edna Richardson and Margaret Eccleston. Their membership is down to 6 now, due to illness, moving and losing some to passing.

Mildred Coe first suggested that raising money for Cops for Cancer would be a perfect fundraiser. These 6 hardworking ladies have been raising money for the Tour de Rock for 10 years. They raise funds all year by holding a garage sale/car wash, plant sale, raffles and a Christmas Craft fair. These events make it possible for them to donate money every September when the Tour de Rock passes through Union Bay on their annual ride. This year they donated \$4000.00

The tired riders always look forward to their stop at the Union Bay Hall where these ladies are there to greet them with a warm place to rest, hot coffee, tea and their famous homemade cookies. Chairs are set up in the Bill Wood room for the riders and supporters to watch the Friendly Port Seniors present Tour de Rock with their donation. They also accept with much appreciation, private donations and a donation from the Pythian Sisters before they say their goodbyes and get back on their bikes to continue their ride to Victoria.

Mildred said that with age it is hard for some to do the things they used to and welcome anyone who would like to help with their events.

The Friendly Port Ladies would like to thank all of the volunteers who have helped throughout the years in making their part in the fight against cancer a success.

"Christmas is coming, the goose is getting fat": CHRISTMAS PAST IN UNION BAY

When Eaton's fall catalogue arrived Christmas was coming! Right on the front was Eaton's Beauty, a new model each year; the doll every little girl dreamed of. She was 21 inches tall, with a beautiful complexion, real hair, dressed in satin and lace.

By the beginning of December, Christmas cakes, puddings, and shortbread had to made, using favorite recipes, then stored carefully in the pantry. How wonderful to come home from sleigh riding to the warm delicious- smelling kitchen and sample the newly made gingerbread cookies.

Japanese oranges packed into little wooden boxes appeared for \$59c in Fraser and Horne's store and added to the excitement. The local papers were watched for news of the CPR train bringing turkeys from the prairies. One year gloom was cast over the Comox Valley as the turkey train was held up due to a slide in the Rockies. But it eventually arrived in time. Hundreds of naked turkeys, with their heads tucked into paper bags, hung from every hook in the butcher shops.

Extended families came home for the holiday. At the Glovers there was always music. Every Christmas morning Harry sat down at his Organ, pulled out all the stops and woke the family with "Christians Awake". Meanwhile in his home on McLeod Road brother Herbert was pounding out the same piece on his piano.

Dinners were the highlight of the festivities. In the big farmhouse Mrs. McKay with her daughters prepared food for about 45. Two turkeys were stuffed and cooked in the oven of the giant coal and wood stove. Mountains of home-grown vegetables were boiled. Bottles of cranberry sauce, made from berries picked at Fanny Bay, were opened along with pickles and relish. Dessert was plum pudding with lemon sauce or rich dark Christmas cake topped with almond paste. In the end not only the turkeys were stuffed.
