You must sign up before hand and bring your Care Card on the day.



A big **THANK YOU** to all the volunteers who helped with the September garage sale. \$1,334.20 was raised by the Community Club and the Port Seniors for the Tour De Rock bicycle ride and \$1,334.20 was raised by the Lion's for the Child Development Centre. ELECTRIC POWER COMES TO UNION BAY

The first power at Union Wharf was generated by coal, and only used to drive all the machines and tools in the shops. In 1911 the Colliery Company built a large electrical plant powered by water on the Puntledge River. A railway was extended from the mainline to the dam and plant on Power House Road in Courtenay to bring equipment and a large power shovel purchased from the



Panama Canal after it was completed. The dam was at the outlet of Comox Lake from which a huge wooden flume took the water to the plant.

In 1914 the wooden poles and line were put though to Union Bay. All the Company shops were converted, and gradually the company homes were wired and the line was extended along the front street to light up the stores and hotels. The press in November 1919 reported that the Union Bay Boy Scouts were demanding street lights. A month later, the Company put a 100-watt light on every third pole. The citizens were delighted. Postmaster Fred Brown turned them on at dusk and off at dawn.

After it was built, the Puntledge Plant was the sole supplier of electricity in the district. Cumberland, Courtenay and Royston each had their own distribution plants which bought power from CC(D)L. Householders paid 10c per KWH. The power plant was 25-cycle while most of B.C. was 60-cycle. Visitors often complained that the lights flickered, but this went unnoticed by the locals. Heating elements such as heaters or toasters could use either cycle but motors such as fridges and vacuums could not. The 25-cycle version was more expensive. The Electrical department at the Colliery Union Bay shops installed and serviced all of the Puntledge Power Co. electrical equipment at the plant, mines and docks.

By 1947 the district light companies were acquired by the B.C. Power Commission which built the John Hart Dam at Elk Falls. All of the district with the exception of Union Bay was converted to 60 cycle. Homeowners in the district which changed to 60 cycle sold their 2nd hand motors and Union Bay people got great deals on fridges and motors. But soon, in 1953, the B.C Power Commission bought the Puntledge Power Plant and reconstructed it to 60 cycle. A few of you "old timers" will remember the changeover when Union Bay was finally brought into the 20th century.

P.F. Mc Nally was the first electrical engineer. George Cooper, a recent immigrant from England, worked as the company's electrician and kept the lights on and the meters read for 25 years. George Dutfield was the engineer during the changeover in the 50's.


