

The purpose of this meeting is to approve Financial Statements, Auditors' Report and Directors' Reports.

REMEMBERING WORLD WAR TWO

By the time of the 2nd World War most everyone had a radio, so via the CBC, people at home had access to troop movement, battles, air raids and casualties. Many had a map of the world on the dining room wall, where Allied advances could be followed as Lorne Green, "the voice of doom" read the news. With a war that encompassed most of Europe, North Africa, and after 1941 the Pacific, there were many areas to report on. Over 50 fighting men from Union Bay were stationed in different parts of the world, and held the interest of all the citizens.



The government encouraged everyone to write letters and send parcels, at 12c per pound, to the troops. Sending whole newspapers was banned in an effort to reduce the amount of weight of the mail, so articles were clipped and sent. Cigarettes could be sent duty free, in order to assure the fighting men "as many fags as they wanted". In 1941 the airgraph was introduced by the post office to send messages to the troops. Originally costing 10c each, they were reduced to 6c next year. Letters were written on a special one-page form, available from the post office, then reduced and photographed on micro film. The film containing 1,700 letters and weighing just a fraction of the original letters, was mailed to Europe where prints were made of each letter and delivered to the troops. In 1943 an airmail service was started across the Atlantic.

Victory Loans: From the experience of the first World War the Government realized the extent to which money could be made available for war time use. The first Victory War Bonds were issued February 1940. The second campaign was launched when two huge Hudson bombers, the first seen in the district, flew very low and dropped leaflets. Children scrambled to gather them up and read the message: Slogans were adopted to promote sales:

"DO YOUR BIT TO HELP CANADA'S WAR EFFORT"

"BUY BONDS AND BEAT BARBARISM"

"GIVE US THE TOOLS AND WE WILL FINISH THE JOB"

A District total of \$200,000 was met in less than a month. The new "twelve-sided nickel" minted in 1943 had a message in Morse-code around the edge: "WE WIN WHEN WE WORK WILLINGLY"

War Saving Stamps were sold at the post office with the same gimmicks, such as "STAMP OUT THE U-BOATS". Every week children bought a 25c stamp with a plane, warship or tank on it, to fill a book of 16 stamps, total cost \$4.00. In five years the book could be redeemed for \$5.00

UNION BAY GARDENERS

We are a small group of volunteers who maintain the Boulevard Gardens along the Coastal Highway. The group normally meets on the second Tuesday every month (March – October) at 9.00 am for a couple of hours or more. Timing is fairly flexible with gardeners often setting their own work times to suit their schedules or preferences. We have further improved flexibility by having some club members adopt their own garden beds which now stands at about 40%. "The Boat Ramp Crew" works cooperatively with us to look after the grass cutting, fertilizing etc. Currently we have an automated sprinkler system in place which allows us to water every second day.

We encourage any interested volunteers even if they can only spare an hour or so to work independently at any time to get in touch with us. Bring along a

reflective safety vest or wear bright shirt or coat plus your own gardening tools. We have a few spare reflective vests available and cones for when working close to the highway.

UPDATE FROM THE UNION BAY STREAMKEEPERS

The first part of the remediation of the riparian zone next to the ballpark has been completed. The planting of trees will follow in the Spring and the reinforcements of the eroded banks will follow in the summer during the dry spell.

At the end of October, we released:

15,444 Coho into Hart Creek
1,100 Coho into Hindoo Creek
1,625 Coho into Emily Creek

For a total of 18,169 Cohos.

It is too bad that we had to leave quite a few Coho salmon behind due to a shortage of fish tanks.
