

STORIES OF HOMES IN UNION BAY

For the next several articles I will feature historic homes in Union Bay. Many of the earliest settlers: The Cooks, Drews, McCarthys, McKays, Rays, when they arrived to work at the port, about 1884, lived in the large boarding house built and let by the Union Coal Company. First single men lived there then families. It was here that the first Christmas was celebrated with a Christmas tree. For many children it was the first they had ever seen. Mrs. Drew dressed as Santa and gave all the children little gifts.



THE LAVENDER HOUSE:

Soon the families leased land along the highway and built homes. One of the first homes was built by Andrew and Ellen McKay on the property where the "Lavender House" is today. It was a small house with tiny rooms, which were papered inside with newspapers. With a barn at the back the McKays ran a livery stable where horses could be rented for a trip to Cumberland, or exchanged to complete their journey. Their oldest son, Bob, the first boy born in Union Bay, was in charge of the horses and also hired out ploughing fields. Not far from this house Mrs. McKay's brother, Andrew McCarthy, built an old type Irish house with animals living in one end. They had the first child, Greta, born in the fledgling town.

The McKays bought farmland south of the town and sold their small house to John and Elizabeth Cook, who tore down the barn and used the lumber to build the present house, about 1907. Mrs. Cook had a black walnut organ which had travelled by horse and wagon across the States to Portland, then put on a ship to the Bay where she played it for Church. She also made Ice cream and sold cones at the gate.

Several families called the house home: Customs Officer Abrams, Seymour & Greta (Post Master Brown's daughter) brought up their family of three there. The Vowels, Fred and Mame (granddaughter of the Cook's) with Eddie & Ann enjoyed the house. Also, the McBride family living next door to Mrs. McBride's cousin, Elizabeth Renwick, called the house home. About 1990 Alex and Kathleen Kinasewich bought the house. Alex, a carpenter, made many changes, even added a loft upstairs. Sometime after 2000 Kathleen had the front yard ploughed and planted with lavender. When it bloomed it was a beautiful sea of purple. Kathleen held parties for groups of friends who helped harvest the lavender. In the back-yard Alex converted a shed into a store where Kathleen made and sold lavender products: sashays, tea, soap, perfume, candles etc. The enterprise did not last long, and the next owners did not cultivate the lavender.


