

### Union Bay may be bigger than you think!

It stretches from the Tsable River in the south, to Spindrift Road in the north, and unfortunately encompasses 3 postal codes.

- ➤ Union Bay center, including the post office uses V0R 3B0.
- ➤ To the south including Buckley Bay, Walker Road, Mystery Beach Road (all are addressed Fanny Bay) use V0R 1W0.
- ➤ To the north, (all addressed Courtenay) have postal codes starting with V9N.



### STORIES OF HOMES IN UNION BAY cont'd:

Two months have passed since an historical item was written. I will continue writing on buildings going north along the highway This one is about the 7th from the Post Office and Gaol.



The property where the Art Shop is today has gone through many changes. First it was a Confectionery built by Mrs. Hilda Anderson. Before this, she built and ran a very profitable Confectionery on the beach, opposite the school. In mid-life she returned to her home in Sweden for an extended stay, leaving the business to her son Ed, and his wife Kathleen They also installed gas pumps.

When she returned to Canada she built another Confectionery on the property next to Hudson's store. She enjoyed serving the public and was a very progressive lady, being first in town to own a gramophone, a big square box with a silver horn speaker which played cylinder records. She also had a player piano in the shop. Along with coffee, candies, pop and ice cream, she sold "Hot Tamales" (corn meal and chicken wrapped in corn husks) that were made and delivered to her store from the Oasis restaurant in Nanaimo.

Her new store had a large front room with counters displaying large bottles of candies. There were tables and chairs for customers. Outside, along the front was a long veranda, at back were living quarters with kitchen/living room and two bedrooms. There was an outhouse out back.

After Mrs. Anderson left, "Jim the Barber" Gunnis set up shop. Into the large front room, along with a barber chair, Jim brought a beautiful pool table with plenty of chairs for onlookers. You could not expect a fast hair cut because if there was a pool game in progress, he'd leave you, and with scissors and comb in hand, walk over to the pool game in progress and make suggestions on a tough shot.

The McKays delivered milk to the barber, and one day in 1943 when Cassie left the milk, he said to her, "If you don't see me tomorrow, have a look inside. I might be dead". Sure enough, the next day she found Jim dead of a heart attack.


At this time the Bowdens, Clara and Bill, were running Hudson's store next door. So, they bought the building and moved into the back of the shop. The front was used to keep extra stock, and as Bill was a butcher, there was the big fancy sausage-making machine. Next to live in the house were Bob Treloar and his family. Soon after, the property was bought by the Union Bay Credit Union. The original building was torn down, and a cement brick building was built which is still in use today.

#### **UNION BAY GARDENERS**

We are a small group of volunteers who maintain the Boulevard Gardens along the Coastal Highway. These stretch from south of McLeod to the Old School with parts in front of Union Bay Market and Union Bay Automotive. The group normally meets on the second Tuesday every month (March – October)



at 9.00 a.m. for a couple of hours or more. Timing is flexible with gardeners often setting their own work times to suit their schedules or preferences. We have further improved flexibility by having most club members adopt their own garden beds. "The Boat Ramp Crew" works cooperatively with us to look after the grass cutting, fertilizing etc. Currently we have an automated sprinkler system in place which allows us to water every second day during the drier summer months.

Due mainly to illness and advancing age our regular members have decreased in number and now cover only 59% of the total garden beds. This hampers the efforts of our current volunteers to keep up with routine maintenance such as weeding and pruning. We encourage any interested volunteers, even if they can only spare an hour or so to get in touch with us. Bring along a reflective safety vest, wear a bright shirt or coat plus bring your own gardening tools. We have a few spare reflective vests available and cones for when working close to the highway.

Our automatic sprinklers were purchased through donations from the community. In the past we have received donations from residents of Union Bay and outside areas plus businesses and governmental agencies which allows us to operate successfully. Any future donations no matter how small are always welcome. Assistance from volunteers who have practical experience in operating and repairing automatic sprinkler systems would also be greatly appreciated.
