#### Union Bay Community Hall Flood


I was at the hall Monday December 27 in the afternoon inspecting for roof leaks with all the snow. I noticed a puddle of water on the dining room Lino near the gym wall, could not see where it came from so I cleaned it up. Late Monday evening Jen called and informed me of a few leaks she found and put buckets out like we did for the gym leaks. That would get us by until the morning when I went in about 10am to check. Luckily I was delayed as the damage could have been much worse if I got there before the water pipe burst in the kitchen. Jen's call was the saving grace as no one would have been there Tuesday if nothing had been noticed. I showed up to a roaring sound from the kitchen. Water was shooting up to the ceiling, there was about 1.5" of water in the kitchen leading out into the dining room. I rushed down stairs to turn the water mains off. Went into the daycare and the water was gushing through the ceiling. I called Anita to get her staff in to save her equipment from too much damage, then called Darcy for help. He showed up quick and found a restoration company that was there in less than a half hour. He also got the big shop vac to remove as much water from the kitchen floor to stop the volume of water going into the daycare while I contacted the insurance company and started the claim.

We were very fortunate timing wise as Ripple Rock Restoration were the last company available that could come with the equipment as the north island had just declared a state of emergency with all the water damage from pipe bursts. Things have settled down, fans and dehumidifiers have been removed, daycare has moved upstairs to the gym thanks to a bunch of community help showing up. Very much appreciated. Water did not get to the new toddler room. Renovations will begin sometime this month.

The daycare needs a new ceiling, flooring, south carpeted wall is being re done, lower kitchen flooring and ceiling tiles. The dining room and upper kitchen flooring needs to be replaced. Other problems may arise during the renovation.

We are a non-profit community hall. Our deductible is \$10,000. We have asked the CVRD for some help and will also be posting a request for community donations to help us out.

There is a \$20 minimum for a tax receipt but certainly no maximum.


